When you are discouraged, turn to Deuteronomy 1:21 where we read, "Behold, the LORD thy God hath set the land before thee: go up and possess it, as the LORD God of thy fathers hath said unto thee; fear not, neither be discouraged." Many of our favorite hymns tell us what to do when discouraged.

Someone asks, "Why should I feel discouraged, why should the shadows come?" We should rather remember that "I sing because I'm happy. I sing because I'm free. For His eye is on the sparrow and I know He watches me." The beloved hymn, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus," gives us sound advice in saying we should "never be discouraged" over a burden, for we can "take it to the Lord in prayer." The spiritual, "There Is a Balm in Gilead" says: "Sometimes I feel discouraged and think my work's in vain and then the Holy Spirit revives my soul again."

So if you're discouraged today, remember that a moment in the presence of our Lord can change your attitude. Count your blessings. Realize you're more valuable than the sparrows. Take it to the Lord in prayer, and let the Holy Spirit revive your soul again.

Do not fear or be discouraged. But if discouragement comes, and it will, then try two things:

First: Do what David did in I Samuel 30:6, "And David was greatly distressed; for the people spake of stoning him, because the soul of all the people was grieved, every man for his sons and for his daughters: but David encouraged himself in the LORD his God." Begin to search the scripture for passages that will strengthen yourself in the Lord.

Second: Do what God told Moses to do for Joshua in Deuteronomy 1 :38, "But Joshua the son of Nun, which standeth before thee, he shall go in thither: encourage him: for he shall cause Israel to inherit it." Find someone today or this week and "Encourage them." Maybe it is a family member, one of your children, a friend, or someone in the ministry. By the way, it may be the person sitting next to you in church on any given Sunday.

When upon life's billows you are tempest-tossed,When you are discouraged, thinking all is lost,Count your many blessings, name them one by one,And it will surprise you what the Lord has done.

Are you ever burdened with a load of care? Does the cross seem heavy you are called to bear? Count your many blessings, every doubt will fly, And you will keep singing as the days go by.

When you look at others with their lands and gold, Think that Christ has promised you His wealth untold; Count your many blessings — money cannot buy Your reward in heaven, nor your home on high.

So, amid the conflict whether great or small, Do not be discouraged, God is over all; Count your many blessings, angels will attend, Help and comfort give you to your journey's end.

Refrain: Count your blessings, name them one by one, Count your blessings, see what God has done! Count your blessings, name them one by one, Count your many blessings, see what God has done. And it will surprise you what the Lord has done.
